## MICRO LISTENING TECHNIQUE AND ITS IMPORTANCE IN LANGUAGE LEARNING

### MICRO LISTENING

Choose something you enjoy listening to.

Should be native speaker's video/podcast, not English learning video, because it's not the real English.

Turn subtitles OFF.

Listen until you don't understand. Pause where you don't understand and go back, listen again.

You can listen again and again until you can understand what they are talking about and write it down.

3 sentences will be enough for the first time.

Listen as many times as you need. Because you should fully understand them.

After you have fully understood and have written what you listened now turn subtitles ON.

Turn subtitles ON only to check what you wrote.

Compare and check what you wrote and understood.

Compare the sentences from subtitle and your own ones, it will show you your mistakes, examine them.

Add new vocabulary to a vocabulary notebook.

If there are words that you didn't know, write them down and learn by heart, broaden your vocabulary treasure.

These are 6 steps of how to do micro listening. When you have done this whole work, do it again. This strategy is very useful because various types of language learning approaches are here.

### Conclusion

Listening is not just about learning how to sound native with the help of it, but also about the knowledge that we get from it. For example, there is not only one strategy which helps us to boost our listening skill. As the listening is considered as "Cinderella" skill in language learning, there are hundreds of strategies that we should know and finally use in our daily life.

As David Nuan (pp 239) mentions, if you are listening to a new music of your favourite singer, here you should use specific strategy; or if you are listening to a new podcast in a channel you should use another strategy of listening with specific instructions. This means, students should be flexible in every step of language learning.
