

## **Data collection**



### **Data Analysis**

- 1.A total of 46 teachers and students participated in this survey. The research showed that 60.9 percent of teachers and students who participated in the survey2 Believe that grammar rules are very important, 30.4 % believe that they are important and 8.7 % believe that they are not important in learning English.
- 67.4 percent of language learners learned English from various grammar books, and the remaining 32.6 percent through video lessons.
- 3. All the language learners who participated in this survey are supporters ofteaching English grammar in an interactive way.



- 84.8 % of students and teachers found it boring to explain big topics while teaching English grammar. And 15.2 percent of them said that they like thisprocess and actually try to explain it.
- 4. 97.8 percent of the participants in the survey believed that grammar is very important for speaking and writing skills and the remaining few did not affect otherskills.



- 5. 43.5 percent of people believe that focusing all students' attention, 32.6% of students in a group are of different levels and 23.9 percent of people believe that grammar is more boring that other skills, which causes various difficulties in teaching English grammar.
- 41.3 % of people prefer to study English grammar with a teacher, 26.1 % with group and 32.6 percent of people prefer to study grammar individually.

### Conclusion and Recommendation

In conclusion, I can say that after considering the above points, I am once again convinced that I did not make a mistake in covering the grammar skill for my article. Because for foreign language learners, grammar is the most painful part of this language.
