Over time, this word can go out of circulation and be forgotten or used in limited areas or widely used.

It is worth saying that no date indicates the changed time of any language, and therefore it is very difficult to determine the time and method of forming a particular word. In fact, the appearance of words in English is usually associated with the arrival of New Peoples and rulers in English-speaking areas. It is worth adding that some of these dates are associated with the period when another ruler was brought into politics, which encouraged language change. As we see as an example, Queen Elizabeth was very fond of the theater, which stimulated the growth of English drama during this period. William Shakespeare alone, the best-known English writer, was credited with introducing about 1,700 new words and phrases into English through his works.

The introduction of other barbarian words into English was also influenced by the growth of the world economy and the expansion of trade among peoples.

Thus, many barbarian words from Japanese, Russian, Italian, German, French, Chinese, Spanish and even Persian have entered the English language. Let's look at some of these.

1. Barbarian words that entered from the old Norwegian language.
